CHAPTER 136.

An Act respecting the Department of National Defence.

SHORT TITLE.

1. This Act may be cited as the Department of National Defence Act. 1922, c. 34, s. 1. Short title.

INTERPRETATION.

2. In this Act and in any orders and regulations made hereunder, unless the context otherwise requires, Definitions.

(a) "Department" means the Department of National Defence; "Department."

(b) "Deputy Minister" means the Deputy Minister of National Defence; "Deputy Minister."

(c) "Minister" means the Minister of National Defence; "Minister."

(d) "prescribed" means prescribed by this Act, or by regulations made hereunder. 1922, c. 34, s. 2. "Prescribed."

3. There shall be a department of the Government of Canada which shall be called the Department of National Defence, over which a minister of the Crown shall preside who shall be the Minister of National Defence. 1922, c. 34, s. 3. Department and Minister of National Defence.

4. The Minister shall be charged with all matters relating to defence, including the Militia, the Military, Naval and Air Services of Canada. 1922, c. 34, s. 4. Services included.

5. There shall be a Deputy Minister of National Defence, who shall be appointed by the Governor in Council. Deputy Minister.

2. Such officers, clerks and employees as are necessary for carrying on the business of the Department may be appointed in the manner authorized by law. 1922, c. 34, s. 5; 1918, c. 12. Officers, clerks, etc.

6. The Governor in Council may make such orders and regulations as are deemed necessary or advisable for the proper and efficient administration and organization of the Department. 1922, c. 34, s. 6. Regulations.
