As advised by you, we have conducted an additional search for the following information:

His record of the different types of work he did, a copy of which was deposited in the National Gallery of Canada Library Document Centre. The listing covers 8,875 works of all types including 100 lithographs, 200 engravings (views of Old Montreal), 50 portraits, 25 sculptures (portraits and bas-relief) and many landscapes of the Laurentians and other locations in Quebec and other provinces of Canada.

Enclosed are the records relevant to your request which are disclosed under the authority of the *Access of Information Act*. You will note that certain portions of the records have been withheld pursuant to the following sections of the Act: 18(a) [financial/commercial information belonging to a government institution]; and 19(1) [personal information].
